#### **Tentative Ruling:**

To approve the report by the settlement administrator. Within five days of service of the order by the clerk, class counsel shall submit to the court an amended judgment consistent with this order.

#### **Explanation:**

In the 2/6/2024 order granting final approval of the class action settlement the court set a hearing date to inform the court of the total amount actually paid to the class members, pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 384, subdivision (b), so that the judgment can be amended and the distribution of any cy pres funds can be ordered. In this case, 95 checks totaling \$58,995.71 have not been cashed (12 because no address could be found for the class member). The check cashing period expired on 11/27/2024. In the process of giving notice of the settlement the settlement administrator had already searched for and obtained current addresses when available for all class members. Pursuant to the terms of the settlement, the uncashed funds will go to the California State Controller's Office's Unclaimed Property Division in the names of the settlement class members.
